## Case Study: Flash Flooding

### Impact of Community Participation and Planning on Recovery

**Goal:** Evaluate the impact that pre-disaster planning and community participation had on shaping economic recovery after a dangerous flood in a historic city.

#### Context

Ellicott City is an unincorporated town in Howard County, Maryland. Founded in 1772 at the bottom of a valley by Johan and Joseph Ellicott, specifically to harness the power of the Tiber and Patapsco Rivers to power the brothers' mills, the terrain of the city includes steep inclines and an abundance of nonporous granite. The town has been prone to flooding since its founding, with most previous floods originating from the Patapsco River at the bottom of the valley and spreading into the city.

On July 30, 2016, Ellicott City was caught in a two-hour deluge that dropped six inches of water. As a result, a volume of water large enough to fill an eighty-story tall, one-acre building surged out of the tributaries above the town and gushed through the historic district along Main Street. The water affected 104 businesses and 90 homes, wrecking the economic heart of the city.

As a result of the flood, Ellicott City experienced \$67.2 million in reduced economic activity, a reduced labor income of \$27.2 million from a loss of 151 jobs, and an approximate decrease in county government revenue of \$1.3 million. The President signed a major disaster declaration for Howard County 48 days later. The county received Public Assistance (PA) and Hazard Mitigation (HM) funds, as well as a Small Business Administration (SBA) emergency loan qualification.

#### Special Considerations

Prior to the flood, Howard County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) staff had attended a FEMA training that assisted OEM in formulating and documenting a Recovery Framework which identified 10 Recovery Support Functions (RSFs) crucial to local disaster recovery. OEM received buy-in from all agencies identified in the Recovery Framework to lead the 10 RSFs.

#### Howard County's Six Guiding Principles for Recovery

1. **Healing:** Foster the healing process for community members through the access of a wide range of social and financial resources.
2. **Economy:** Expedite business recovery and restore long-term economic growth.
3. **Stability:** Find immediate and long-term housing solutions for residents displaced by the flooding.
4. **Rebuilding:** Rebuild Historic Ellicott City with an emphasis on resilient infrastructure through flood mitigation.
5. **Preservation:** Preserve Historic Ellicott City's unique and cherished architectural characteristics that have always attracted visitors.
6. **Environment:** Pursue and implement projects that ensure the continued vitality of our natural resources in pursuit of sustainable quality of life.

#### Actions Taken

Within 24 hours of the flood, the county restricted access to damaged areas, began stabilization work, and brought in an Incident Management Team (IMT). Lori Hodges, a Director of Emergency Management in Colorado, was a crucial member of the IMT. Hodges had previously experienced similar flooding in her home county, and her insights allowed Howard County leadership to anticipate and begin problem-solving previously unforeseen challenges.

Expediting economic recovery was a key priority. A major contribution from the Howard County Economic Development Authority (HCEDA) was to conduct "micro-missions," escorting affected residents into the disaster area in four-wheel utility vehicles. As a direct result of these micro-missions, HCEDA determined that SBA loans were unsuited to address recovery needs in Ellicott City and instead qualified individuals for gap-loans from HCEDA. HCEDA also assisted with flood insurance questions and helped struggling business owners rework their business models. Finally, to jumpstart businesses reopening, Howard County waived \$38,000 in fees and expedited 203 permits.

Howard County also worked to identify volunteer organizations and community leaders like Pastor Adam Feldman. Feldman led the volunteer effort in Ellicott City and helped create One EC, a local









# Waldorf Station



- Construction is underway on Phase 1 of the retail center at Waldorf Station.
- Tenants include:
  - Starbucks
  - Pollo Campero
  - Honeygrow
  - Potbelly
- The Ironwood, a 302-unit apartment community, opened in Summer of 2025 with strong leasing.

# Charles County Sports and Wellness Complex



- In 2024, Charles County purchased the former Sears Building and announced plans to redevelop the building into a Sports and Wellness Complex featuring a competitive swimming complex.
- The County also purchased an outparcel with plans for an EMS facility.

# Charles County Sports and Wellness Complex



- Community input sessions are now complete.
- Conceptual design work is underway.

# Morgantown Generating Station



- TeraWulf, a Maryland based energy and digital infrastructure company, purchased the 355-acre parcel.
- TeraWulf will phase the redevelopment to include significant environmental remediation and modernization of energy generation facilities.

# Data Centers

## Public Process – Current Status

- The County is in the public Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) process to define where data centers may be considered and what standards would apply.
- This is a policy-level framework only — ***no site-specific projects or approvals are under review.***
- Public input to date has focused on infrastructure, environmental safeguards, and performance standards.


## Economic Development Department (EDD) Role

- Provides industry research and economic context to inform County leadership and the public.
- Supports public education and interagency coordination.
- Does not regulate zoning, land use, or permitting.

# Maryland Business Support Programs

## Public Behavioral Health Community Services

### (Non-Medicaid Eligible Individuals and All Others)

- This program provides services for mental health, substance use, and addiction. It helps people who do not qualify for Medicaid but have financial and clinical needs
- Targeted at County governments and non-profit organizations that provide behavioral health services
- Funds support the delivery of mental health, substance use, and addictive disorder services

## Safe Streets and Roads for All

- U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) funded grant program
- Grants help local, regional, and Tribal communities, including County governments, towns, and non-profits prevent deaths and serious injuries on roads.
- Funds support planning, demonstration, and implementation activities to improve road safety. Demonstration activities can include feasibility studies using quick-build strategies, pilot programs for safety behaviors, and testing new technologies like speed cameras or adaptive signals

# Maryland Business Support Programs

## The Judith P. Hoyer Early Child Care and Education Enhancement Program

- This program helps at-risk children from birth to age six and their families prepare for school. It gives grants to childcare providers
- Childcare providers who serve at-risk children from birth to age six and their families
- Funds support accreditation and professional development programs for staff

## NourishMD Grant Program

- Newly approved grant program which expands access to fresh foods in food-insecure communities. It provides grants to eligible food retailers to support operations and improvements.
- Eligible applicants include grocery stores, corner stores, co-ops, farm stands, farmers' markets, delivery retailers, and small food-focused stores
- Businesses must serve a community with a Maryland Community Business Compass (MCBC) Fresh Food Gap Score of 60% or higher.
- Applicants submit a complete application through the DHCD portal between January 20 and February 20.


